

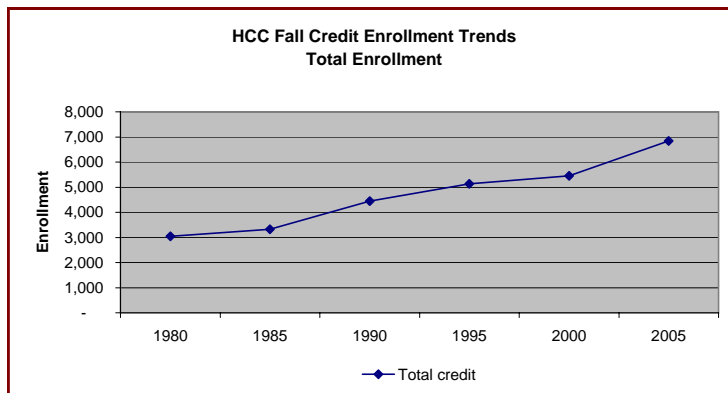

Total Enrollment

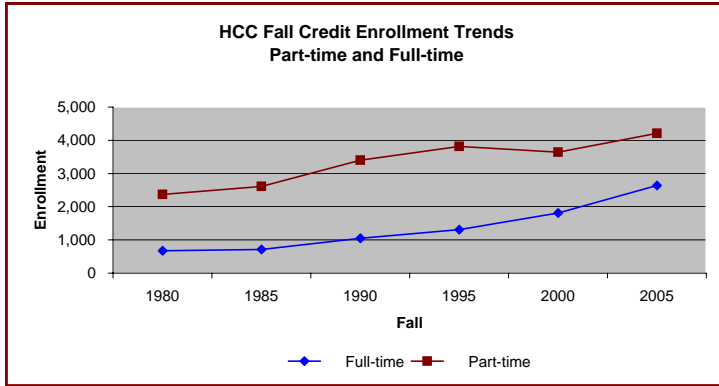
Over the last 30 years, fall credit enrollment increased by 125% from 3,042 in Fall 1980 to 6,841 in 2005.

Part-time and Full-time Enrollment

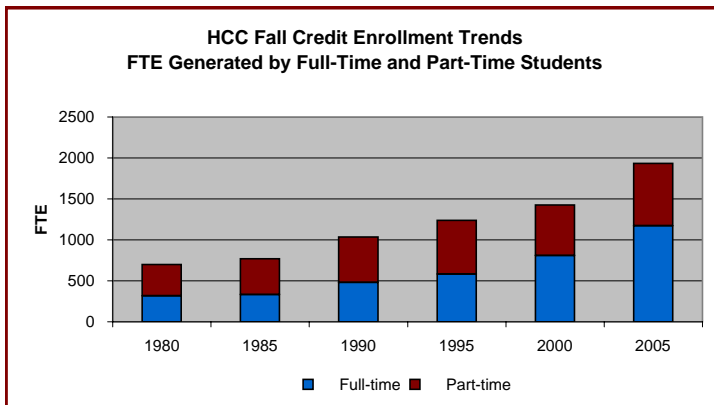
Full-time enrollment increased 290% from 675 students in Fall 1980 to 2,635 students in 2005. Part-time enrollment increased 78% from 2,367 to 4,206 for the same time interval.

FTE Generated by Full-time and Part-time Students

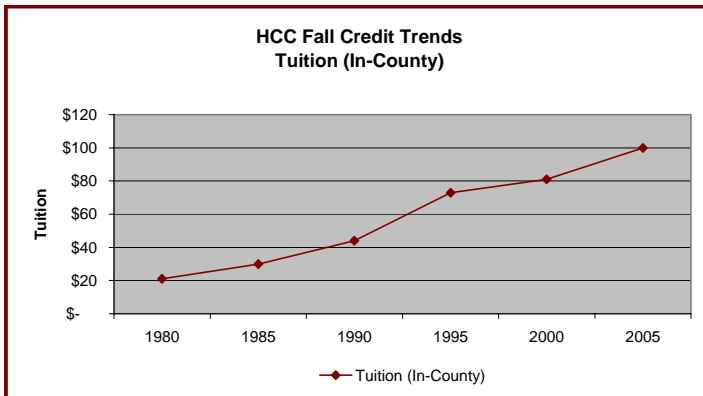
FTE generated by Fall credit students increased by 177% in the last 30 years from 698 in 1980 to 1,934 in 2005.

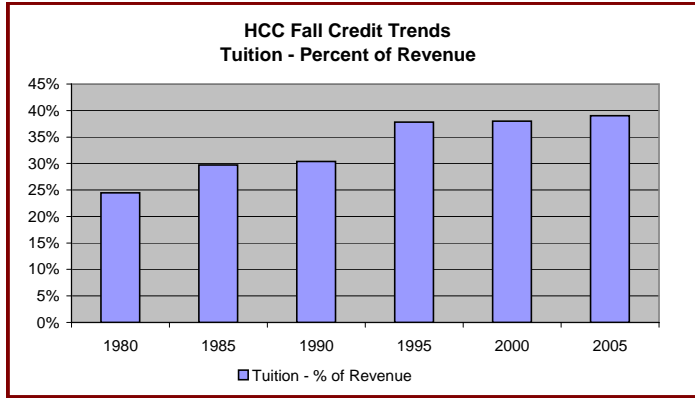
Tuition (In-county)

Tuition - Percent of Revenue

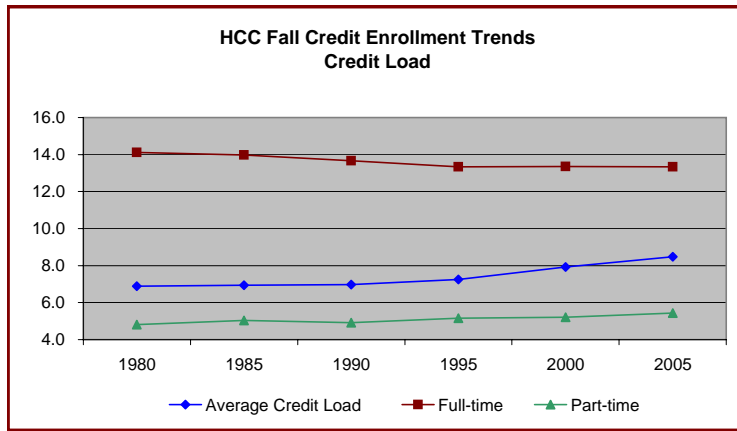

Credit Load

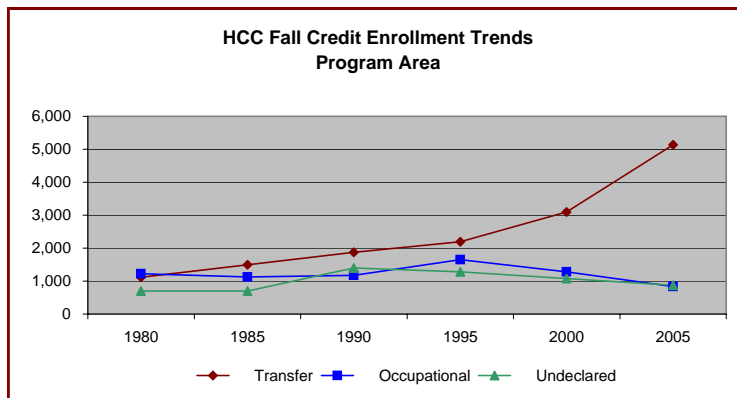
The average credit load increased by 23% from 6.9 to 8.5 in the 30 year interval. Full-time credit load went down by 6% and part-time credit load increased by 13%.

Program Area

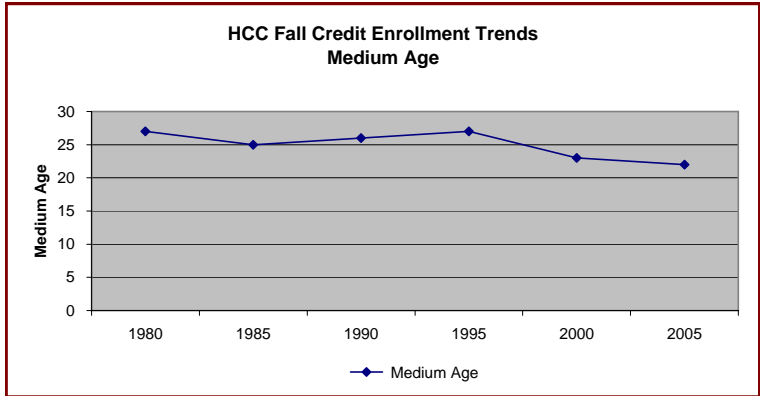
There was a 359% increase in the number of students enrolled in transfer programs from Fall 1980 to Fall 2005. The number of students enrolled in occupational programs decreased by 32% over the last 30 years, with the sharpest decrease over the last decade.

Median Age

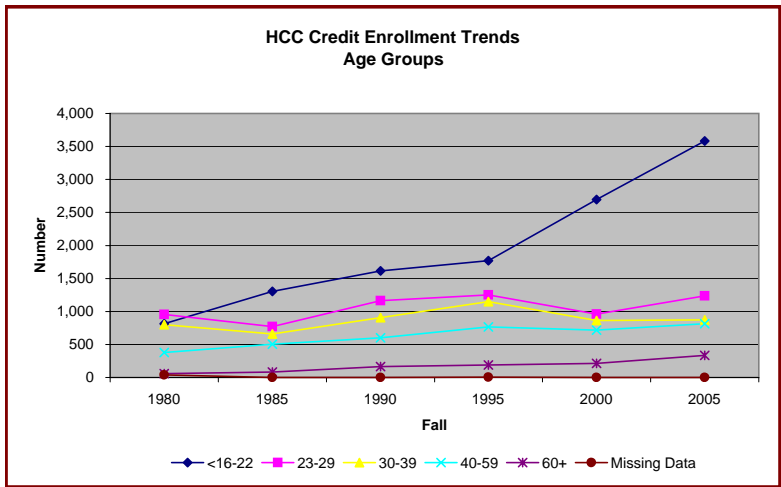
The median age of a student enrolled in fall credit classes has gone down 19% over the last 30 years with the sharpest decline from 1995 to 2000. Part of the drop may be attributed to the way age is calculated in the new computer system.

Age Groups

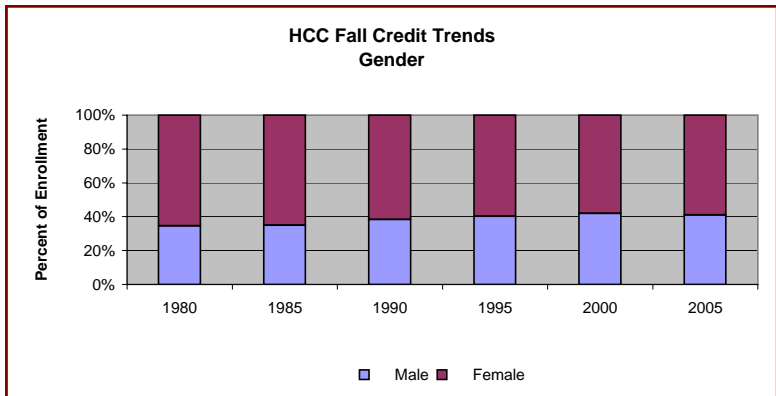
The 16 to 22 year old age group increased 341% from 813 students in 1980 to 3,582 students in 2005. Although the 60+ age group represented a smaller percentage of the total enrollment, it had the largest percent change, 469%, from 59 students in 1980 to 336 students in 2005 in spite of a 12% decrease between 1995 and 2000.

Gender

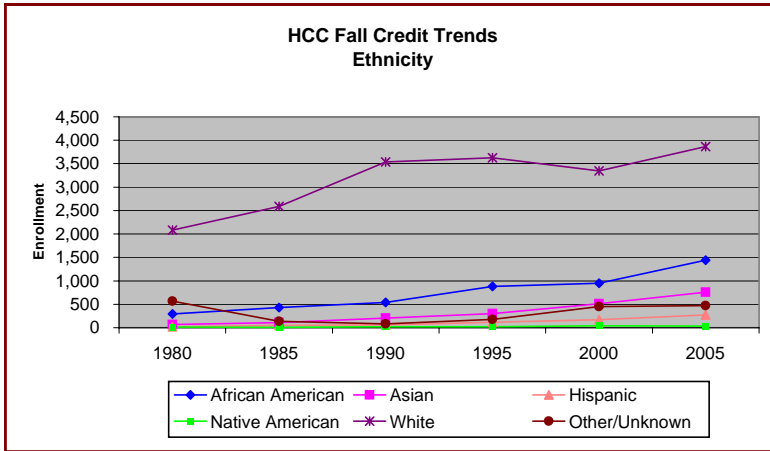
Thirty years ago, males made up 35% of the fall credit enrollment. In Fall 2005, the percentage of the enrollment that were males only had a slight increase to 41%.

Ethnicity

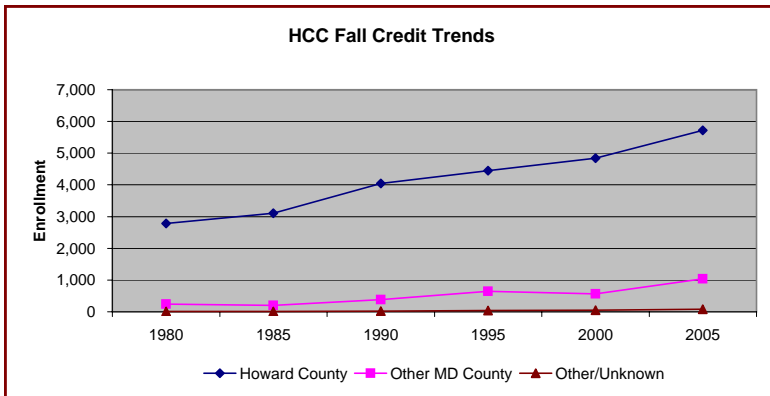
All races showed an increase in the percent of enrollment over the last 30 years. Hispanic enrollment showed the greatest increase over the 30 year period with a 1200% increase from the Fall 1980 to Fall 2005.

Residence

The percentage of Howard County residents attending HCC in the Fall of 1980 decreased slightly from 92% of the Fall 1980 enrollment to 84% in 2005. Other Maryland residents enrolled in credit classes in Fall 1980 increased from 8.2% of the enrollment to 15% in Fall 2005.
