Intermediate Arabic II

Description

In this second intermediate level course, students will be exposed to more higher-level text and develop a better comprehension of bilateral and weak verb forms. Students will practice more conversational exchanges and greatly expand their working vocabulary. (4 hours weekly)

Statement on General Education and Liberal Learning

3. Read and be familiar with a variety of paragraph level text
4. Write a formal letter of request or complaint
5. Take notes while listening to someone speaking
6. Make a brief oral presentation on an aspect of target culture
7. Appreciate the Arabic language as an expression of its culture

Major Topics

- I. Practicing the use of verb tenses and moods
- II. Challenging students to converse more in the target language
- III. Mastering the finer grammatical points with useful exercises
- IV. Reading for content and looking for contextual clues
- V. Using idiomatic expressions in writing and speaking

Course Requirements

Course requirements will vary with the instructor and may include quizzes, projects, oral presentations and exams.
