1. Develop an understanding of what the media is, why it's important, and how to study it.
2. Identify methods to analyze media images, narratives, and genres.
3. Discuss the ways in which media represents the world at large and its intertextuality and ideology.
4. Analyze the close connection between media and different types of audiences.
5. Distinguish between different types of media institutions.
6. Discuss case studies in news, advertising, and marketing.
7. Compare and contrast essential media skills such as research and production.
