Description

In this second semester course students will continue to master the sounds and structures of the Korean language. They will further develop vocabulary for everyday situations while learning additional grammatical concepts. Students will be involved with various aspects of Korean culture. (4 hours weekly)

5. Recognize situational vocabulary aurally and in writing
6. Appreciate the culture of Korea

Major Topics

- I. Greeting word and personal information. (Identifying self)
- II. Name Korean food; how to order at restaurant
- III. Moving around; how to ask directions, sightseeing
- IV. Entertainment; movies, sports
- V. Korean numbers and Sino Korean numbers, counting, classifiers, calendar
- VI. Telephone conversation;
- VII. Weather
