MAJOR CRIMINAL JUSTICE/ADMINISTRATION EMPHASIS**

This degree requires the completion of 120 credits in semester hours. Listed below are the remaining requirements. Lower level credits may be completed with additional community college coursework.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (coursework in the humanities, social sciences and natural sciences/math)

21.00 upper level credits

DEPTH REQUIREMENT

A depth in the arts & sciences

A depth in any academic area (will be completed in criminal justice)

A depth consists of 12 completed credits in one academic discipline, with at least 3 of those credits at the upper level. For example, if a student completes 9 credits in history at the community college, completing 1 upper level course in history at Excelsior would constitute a depth. Credits completed for a depth fulfill overall credits needed for the degree - they are not in addition.

- One credit in Information Literacy
