Graduates of an LPN program, which has been validated for statewide LPN-ADN articulation, will be granted transfer credit for NURS 101 and NURS 102 after successful completion of NURS 103. + A student applying to NURS 103 must have placement into ENGL 121 or have completed required English developmental courses.

* These two prerequisite courses must be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.25 (a grade of at least "B" in one of the courses). Exception: Student may substitute a higher grade ("A" or "B") in A&P II for a "C" grade in A&P I.

** These courses must also be completed before applying to NURS 103.

- Be aware that A&P I and A & P II must be no older than 5 years for students applying for Nursing beginning Fall 2003.
- Students in this program must meet with an advisor regularly and maintain current information regarding the policies of the institutions to which they intend to transfer.

A grade of "C" or better is required in nursing, mathematics, and science courses.
