In addition to a Bachelor’s Degree, the State of Maryland requires students to submit their Academic Transcript and one of the Options below to Maryland State Department of Education for evaluation.

**Option I**

- Submit scores from Praxis I: Academic Skills Assessments to the Social Sciences Division (prior to the completion of the 30<sup>th</sup> credit hour recommended)
- The exam assesses basic reading, writing, and mathematics skills. Scores from Praxis I are used for admission to four-year Teacher Education programs and are required for Teacher Certification in Maryland and most other states.
- In Maryland passing scores for Praxis I, are currently 177 in Math, 177 in Reading, and 173 in Writing, or a composite score of 527.

**Option II**

Maryland has a basic skills option for candidates who have obtained the following scores on other tests: SAT composite score of 1100 (Verbal + Math) or SAT composite score of 1000 (if taken prior to 4/95) or ACT composite score of 24 or GRE composite score of 1000. These candidates do not need to take Praxis I.
