- Admission to the Nursing Program is based upon successful completion of required courses. Prerequisite courses must be completed with grades of C or better. For *Fall 2007*, students must complete at least one of the prerequisite courses with a B or an A. For *Fall 2010*, students must complete at least one of the prerequisite SCIENCE courses with a B or an A and have a 2.0 cumulative GPA.
- Applicants for Clinical Classes 2010 and beyond will be required to take a standardized Entrance Exam to qualify for the clinical portion of the program.
- Some students may be eligible for Academic Amnesty; all nursing students are strongly encouraged to see an academic advisor.
- Anatomy and Physiology courses must be completed within five (5) years of beginning the first nursing course. If course work exceeds the five year limit, a student may either take a competency exam(s) to demonstrate proficiency or repeat the course(s). BIOL-107 and CHEM-103 must be completed within ten (10) years of beginning the first nursing course.
- An entrance assessment is required.
