Summary			
<p>A student appeared at the security office to report a possible harassment by a former student. Accompanying the complainant was an Assistant Professor of English. The student stated that she was being harassed and followed by a former student. She stated that she and the male individual sat next to each other in the Assistant Professor's class. The complainant stated that on one occasion the male student came to class and appeared to be very upset about something. She offered him her phone number and told him to call her if he wanted to talk about what was bothering him. She stated that he started calling her on a daily basis and would either leave a voice mail or text message. She stated that she would not listen to the voice mail and deleted them along with the text message. Approximately three weeks into the semester, the male student withdrew from the class. On 3-27-07 the complainant stated that when she parked her vehicle in lot "A", the male individual approached her vehicle. He walked with her to her ceramic class in the HVPA building. She further stated that he placed a piece of masking tape on her back. She asked him if he wrote "Kick Me" on the tape. He then took the tape off her back wrote on it and placed it on her back. Approximately 20 minutes later he reminded her that she still had the tape on her back. She removed it and observed the words, Bite Me/Kiss Me written on the tape. A few days later he called her and invited her out to dinner. She responded, "I have a boyfriend". He continued to call her and leave messages. On 3-29-07 at approximately 10:00 the complainant parked on lot "A" handicapped and was immediately approached by the male individual. He walked with her into her class. On 4-10-07 he again approached her on lot "A" and followed her to her class. She stated that his actions were "Creeping me out". She was asked if she ever gave the male individual a reasonable warning or request to stop confronting her and following her. She stated "no". Howard County Police were called and they responded to the college. After interviewing her, the police officer advised the complainant that absent the reasonable warning or request, there was no crime committed. He took a report to document the incident. Security has offered the complainant escorts to and from her vehicle and her class locations.</p> <p>Security has tried to call the male individual on numerous occasions and received a busy signal each time. This investigation is continuing and follow-up reports are forthcoming.</p>

<p>Upon arrival at security office in the Student Services Building, Security was informed of damage done to vending machine in Hickory Ridge (snack area) first floor. Further investigation revealed that both calls sound alike and both calls addressed her as “Miss” (the same way a student would address a teacher or someone of higher authority. Final investigation revealed that she was never threatened with physical violence or never received a call on her cell phone or house phone. Security was told via a dispatcher that the call is a telephone misuse and not a hate crime. Security also was told by Howard County Police that the staff member can call Howard County Police and make a report over the phone.</p>

Summary			
<p>Two female students reported in person to the security office to lodge a complaint against another student. The one student's complaint was that a male student was harassing her in person and by phone calls. She stated that she first observed the male student late in January when he approached her and a group of her friends while they were sitting on a sofa in the ELB. She states that he just joined in the conversation. Approximately one or two weeks later, he approached her in the Galleria and asked her if she wanted to "hang out". She replied "I don't know". He continued to try to be involved in her group of friends. He would appear and make odd statements that didn't have anything to do with what the group was talking about. He then started to approach her when she was alone. She stated that she was concerned by his behavior. During one of these occasions he picked up her phone which was lying on the table and called his phone thereby gaining her cell phone number. She stated that he made a phone call to her cell phone. He left a message advising her that if she wanted him to leave her alone and not hang around her to let him know. The next morning she text messaged saying "Please leave me alone". That day he confronted her about the message and she cut him off stating "Look I'll be honest with you, I think you're creepy. Please leave me alone". He started to tell her he would call her that night but she walked away. She had no more contact with him for approximately one week. He started again to approach her. She states that on one occasion he asked her if he got on her nerves and if he was distracting. She advised him that he was. He still continued to show up where she and her friends were congregated. She ignored him and he left. After one of these occasions, another student approached the female student and told her that he had told her to tell the other female that "I owe you one". She was not sure what he meant but she was frightened by it. Later he advised the female that what he meant was that "if he hadn't met her and been introduced to her friends there would have been another school shooting. Later that day she was standing outside the ELB. She observed the male student with either a popsicle stick or a lollipop stick in his hand giving the appearance of a handgun. He was pointing out the window at various students and feigning the recoil of a fired weapon.</p> <p>Howard County Police were called and responded to the campus. The male student was taken from his class and interviewed by a Police Officer Case # 07-37737. The Executive Vice President and Vice President of Administration and Finance were present during the interview. The male student admitted making the statement about "another school shooting" and stated that at times he has thought about injuring himself. Based on his statements, the Executive Vice President advised him that he was being suspended from school until further notice. Due to the fact that he admitted to thoughts of injuring himself, the Police Officer removed him from the campus and transported him</p>			

to Howard County General Hospital for an emergency evaluation.
