Summary

Security received a call from 911 informing me that they had received a call from someone telling them that there was a bomb on campus in one of the smoking areas. When Security asked her if she knew the location of the bomb, her response was that she did not know. Security informed the 911 operator that security would check around and if any complications occurred that security would give her a call back. Security then got in touch with all the officers on duty and made them aware of the situation and had them to check all smoking areas in their building. Shortly after informing my crew Security did a check of my building and all classrooms closest to the smoking areas. Security then returned to the office. Mobile I informed a security officer that Howard County Police were on campus doing their own ground investigation. The officer advised Security to standby at the office because a police officer was coming in to see me. The police officer informed Security that the person who called in to report the bomb was a female. The officer informed Security that this individual was currently at the police station giving her statement. At this time the nature of the situation had been down graded due to the fact that as the individual was giving her statement the officers had come to realize that she was reporting a bomb threat that was made Thursday (06-08-2006). She stated that as she was walking in the quad she heard a young male say that he was tired of this school and that he was going to blow it up. No action was taken on that day by the individual. After further investigation at the station, the individual informed the officer that she had recently received a misconduct letter (specific nature of letter unknown) from the college Her mom didn't know anything about the letter. As the story continued to unfold the police officer told Security that they found it strange for her to report a bomb threat a week later. So in conclusion the individual appeared to be more concerned about this misconduct letter she was keeping from her mom, rather than the actual threat. If the threat had been successful and the building evacuated, the meeting with the head department would have been prolonged. Howard County Police had reason to believe that this conclusion is really the source as to why the threat was reported. The police officer stated that the individual was a student at HCC but upon retrieval of her school information she was found not to be in the system. A staff member was notified when the police officer first arrived on the scene and as soon as she left. The officer told Security that after speaking with her lieutenant, that Howard County Police was finished with their investigation because they believed the threat to be an old one.

Howard County Police did bring the K-9 unit in. No bombs were found and no one was evacuated from the buildings. The officer took the individual's statement. Report # 0657259.
