She stated that her reply to him was “no I believe I am taken care of for the Fall”. The male’s reply was (Why am I not surprised), The faculty member stated that she sort of laughed, and the male’s reply was "yeah go on and laugh but you just don't want a white man on campus.” The faculty member stated that the male had worked in the Business and Computer Division before, some time before she started in 2005 so someone may know him. She stated that she felt a little uncomfortable about the call, and felt the need to report it to Security. No further information was provided for this report.</p>

On Wednesday, June 1, 2011 at approximately 6:40pm, Security was called by the Security Lieutenant to report to the HVPA main lobby. Upon arrival, Security observed the Security Lieutenant and five individuals standing by the security desk of HVPA. Security was then informed by the Security Lieutenant that one of the individuals was seen throwing rocks at the building. While questioning the individuals, the Director of Security and other officers arrived on scene to assist with the situation. The Director of Security informed the individuals that they have been told by security on many occasions not to be on campus, and that Howard County Police would be called the next time they were caught trespassing. The Director of Security attempted to get identification information from them but they began acting evasive. At that point, the Director of Security advised them that if they refused to provide the information, or if Security could not contact their parents, that Howard County Police would be notified and they would be charged with trespassing. Security gathered all contact information and relayed the information to dispatch to contact their parents. Two females were identified by HCC staff as not being related to the incident and were released. Security identified the other three individuals. Security was only able to contact one individual's mother who advised that she could not come to pick up her son and was unable to contact anybody that could. Security was unable to reach the other parents because both numbers given were showing as disconnected. Security agreed that the individuals were sufficiently scared enough about being turned over to Howard County Police and decided to provide them with a final warning not to set foot on college property without supervision. Photos were taken of each individual (attached with report), and they were allowed to leave campus under security escort. Review of video footage shows the youth entering the HVPA building via the quad entrance. Footage also shows one of the youth, picking up a stone and throwing it in the direction of the building. No damages were observed. No further information at this time.

At approximately 6:25, Security reviewed the video cameras located in the Dispatch Center but was unable to come up with conclusive footage to support the student's claim. On Monday, June 6, 2011, at approximately 9:45am, Security responded to an incident that occurred inside the ST Parking Garage. Upon arrival, another Security officer was already on the scene and speaking with both individuals involved in the incident. Security approached the individuals and separated the two to begin gathering information of the incident. Security spoke with the (non-student and parent) first, who stated that the other individual was speeding on campus and refusing to stop at any stop signs. The individual said, "She was driving so fast, she could have killed someone. I couldn't even keep up to catch her." The individual began to get belligerent with Security; stating that Security really needs to enforce the speeding laws on campus. Security first apologized to the individual for the unsafe conditions the driver created on campus and then advised her that the Security department is doing their best to ensure our students, visitors and faculty are safe on campus and are aware/adhering to the campus rules and regulations. Security then attempted to get the rest of the individual's identifying information, but she refused and said she wanted to keep her name anonymous. The individual then got into her tan Chevy Tahoe and left campus.

Security spoke with the student - the second individual involved in the incident. The student was crying because of the tone and words the other individual used when speaking to her before Security arrived. The student stated that she; entered the college campus from the Hickory Ridge Road entrance and made her way over to the ST Parking Garage using Campus Drive. The student stated that she stopped at all stop signs leading up to her parking spot. Upon parking her vehicle; silver Toyota Corolla, the individual approached her and started to yell belligerently at her, causing her to cry. Security advised the student that an investigation will be completed before sending the incident to Student Services. No further information at this time.

After reviewing various camera angles and video footage of Campus Drive from the Hickory Ridge entrance to the parking garage; Security found the video footage to be inconclusive with the above report. No further information provided at this time.

On Monday, June 20, 2011, at approximately 7:55pm., Security witnessed the following: While patrolling in the east parking garage on mobile rounds, Security saw a car approaching him at a very high rate of speed. The officer stopped the mobile at the turn of the first half of the third level and tried to stop the driver by yelling stop and pointing his finger at him. The driver (a student), sped by the mobile unit at a speed too fast to make the turn correctly and cut the corner very tight and came very close to the mobile unit. Security turned around and found the student sitting in his car which was parked crooked in the spot. The car was a dark blue, Volkswagen Jetta. Security pulled up behind the student's car and asked him for his student ID. The student refused to give any ID and said that Security has no right to ask for it. Security told the student that he was speeding and driving recklessly and that he did need to show ID to Security and again he refused. The student became very rude to the Security officer and called him several names. The security officer then called for backup and the Security Lieutenant's reported to the scene. The Security officer was advised to call Howard Co. Police by the Security Sergeant. After a few minutes, Security was able to obtain all information from the student once he knew the police were coming. The student did not have his ID card and gave it from memory and his address came from his driver's license. The student was given a copy of the student handbook and was told he could leave after correcting his car in the parking spot. The student then started shaking his head and called the Security officer a "douche". The student then went into the main building returning several minutes later and left the garage at a high rate of speed until getting caught behind a minivan. Security followed the student and witnessed him go through three stop signs before leaving campus. Video of the incident was captured and attached to this report. No further information provided.

On Monday June 20, 2011 at approximately 4:40pm, Security met a student at the quad near Duncan Hall. She was sitting on the ground and another student was standing near her. Upon arrival, Security offered her medical attention but she refused. She stated that she only needed an ice pack. The other student helped her off the ground onto a seat. The injured student stated that she was running down the RCF main stairwell heading towards Duncan Hall. When she arrived at the quad in front of HVPA, the zipper of her boot broke and she rolled her ankle. At that time she took her boot off and walked over to the Duncan Hall quad entrance. She sat on the ground and waited for assistance. The student tried to contact her friend for help to her car but was unable to reach him. Security provided the student with an icepack and again asked her several times if she would like medical attention but she refused. The Security Lieutenant arrived at approximately 5:05pm in the golf cart to escort the student to her car. The student left campus at approximately 5:07pm.

On Wednesday, June 22, 2011, at approximately 3:00pm, the Security Sergeant was leaving HCC for the day. The Sergeant exited parking Lot E at the stop sign facing the construction area. The Sergeant stopped his personal vehicle and then continued left towards Campus Drive. As they were leaving, a white Acura Integra exited parking Lot C, running the stop sign, almost causing a collision with the Sergeant's vehicle. The Sergeant stopped his vehicle to approach the driver. Upon approaching the driver, the driver yelled back in a hostile voice. The Sergeant asked the driver for his identification and the driver stated that he did not have any. The Sergeant stated, "You're driving a vehicle without a driver's license." The driver did not answer back. The driver started to get extremely hostile, including his passengers. The Sergeant asked the driver again, "Do you have ID or do I have to advise Howard County Police that you're driving without a driver's license." The driver immediately gave the Sergeant his driver's license. The passengers exited the vehicle and started to curse heavily at the Sergeant, so the Sergeant immediately called for assistance.

A Security Officer arrived, and the passenger started to yell at him. While attempting to talk to the driver, the passenger continued to raise his voice. A second Security Officer showed up shortly afterwards and attempted to calm the driver and the passenger down and speak with them, but the driver continued to curse at the Sergeant. The driver was identified by his Tennessee driver's license and is an HCC student. The student stated to the Sergeant, while talking to the Security Officer, "If something is on my record, I'm coming for you." The Sergeant replied, "So now you're threatening me." The student stated, "It's not a threat, but I'm coming for you." After collecting all information from the driver and his vehicle, the Sergeant handed back his driver's license. Both individuals did not want to hear neither the Sergeant nor the Security Officer speak to them. The Security Officer repeatedly told the student that he can go ahead and leave campus, but he did not want to leave, because Security had written down his information. The Sergeant was attempting to speak to the student, but his passenger continued to interfere with the conversation. The Sergeant stated to the passenger, "I'm trying to talk to your friend right now." The Sergeant asked the student, if he can tell his friend to be quiet while Security talks to him, but the student yelled back, All four individuals continued to curse and yell while driving away. Plant Operation's staff members witnessed the incident.

No identification information was able to be obtained from any other individuals. The Sergeant immediately called another Sergeant for video footage of the incident. The second Sergeant looked on camera using CCTV Monitoring system and observed that all individuals entered a white Acura Integra. They exited the employee parking spot and continued to drive pass the stop sign, making no attempt to stop. They almost caused a collision with the Security Sergeant's vehicle. On, Wednesday, June 22, 2011 at approximately 5:30pm, Security was on post at main security desk when they received a call from dispatch to report to HVPA 160. Upon arrival, Security noticed the Security Lieutenants talking to staff member in regards to a missing student (a 14yr old). The staff member stated that the student showed up for his trumpet lessons at 5:30pm, then asked to use the bathroom but never returned. At approximately 5:45pm he notified security of the situation. The staff member also stated the student had red hair, a gray shirt, and white shorts with diamond shapes on his shorts. After Security received the description of the individual, dispatch was notified and security began searching for the missing child. At approximately 6:10pm, the student's father called Howard County Police. At approximately 6:25pm, the student's father called his wife to inform her of the situation and it was then security found out that the mother had picked up her child. On Thursday, June 23, 2011 at approximately 6:35pm, Security reported to the Financial Aid office to take a statement from their staff regarding an irate student. Upon arrival, Security met with a Financial Aid staff member who advised that while assisting students, she was approached by a black male student demanding a bookstore notice/voucher. The individual is a student who had recently been on academic restriction. After appealing the restriction and being approved, the individual was attempting to continue taking classes. The staff member stated that she explained to the student that the last day to use or issue a book voucher was 6/20/11. At that point the student began to be irate and demanded to see someone else. The staff member referred him to the Associate Director. Shortly after seeing the Associate Director, the student returned to the staff member's station demanding to be seen right away so that he could file a complaint. In the process of doing so, the staff member stated that he pushed a young child who was in his path. When the student got to her station, the staff member stated that the student leaned over into her face and demanded the name and number of the President. The staff member gave the student the information and he left. Security took a written statement from the staff member and requested to see the Associate Director, who instructed Security to return after her current appointment.

At approximately 6:40, Security returned to the RCF Office where they observed the student speaking with the Security Account Manager. The Security Lieutenant was also present. After their discussion, Security took a written statement from the student where he stated that he had never received a book voucher. He later changed his story to say that he didn't receive the voucher in time to be able to use it. Then he stated that he had never been informed about a book voucher expiration date, and that he did nothing more than inquire about its status and the proper process for getting the voucher re-instated when he was treated badly by Associate Director. The student's written statement is attached to this report.

At approximately 6:51, Security returned to the Financial Aid office and spoke with the Associate Director. She stated that when the student was referred to her, she tried to explain to him what the process was concerning the book voucher expiration date. She stated that she informed the student that he could either pay for the books out-of-pocket, or wait for the refund of the balance of his voucher. She stated that while speaking with the student, he constantly cut her off and tapped his fingers loudly on her desk. The Associate Director stated that she attempted to show him that not only did he receive his book voucher in a timely manner, but that he also used that voucher in the bookstore before the voucher expiration date. However, before she could complete her statement, the student got up and left her office. Security Dispatch was unable to view the incident using the cameras at this time.

FOLLOW-UP:

On 6/24/11, Security followed up on this investigation by contacting HCC Bookstore staff member. The staff member advised that the student received a book voucher of approximately \$635. The period for using that voucher was from May 31 – June 20. At the end of that period Financial Aid would begin the process of refunding students for unused monies. The Bookstore staff member advised that their records show the student making 6 purchases, all on May 16, leaving him a balance of approximately \$350.

On Tuesday, June 28, 2011, at approximately 1:00pm, Security was posted at the Hickory Ridge Kids On Campus Parking Lot, when a driver of a black Nissan Armada refused to stop at a stop sign and by Security directives while directing traffic for Kids On Campus. Security attempted to stop the vehicle, approached the driver side window and asked the driver for his ID. The driver looked at the Security officer, stated something derogatory and drove off, almost running over the officer's feet. As the vehicle was driving away at a high rate of speed, Security attempted to write down his license plate number, but only wrote half down. Security then called Dispatch for immediate assistance with video footage and for the complete license plate number, and advised Dispatch that the black Nissan Armada refused to stop and almost ran both officer's over. After review of the video footage using CCTV monitoring, the vehicle license plate number for the black Nissan Armada was shown. The license plate information was then given to the Director of Security for further investigation. Follow up investigation is still on-going.

After finding the owner of the vehicle, several attempts were made to contact the individual with negative results.
