<p>At approximately 12:36am on March 3, 2011, Security observed a problem with the Athletic and Fitness Center pool while conducting initial patrol of the area. The Athletics and Fitness Center pool appeared to be overflowing, causing localized flooding at a rate greater than the overflow drains surrounding the pool were designed to drain away.</p> <p>Security immediately contacted the on-duty Console Operator/Dispatcher. They advised the shift supervisor of the situation. Security contacted a staff member from Plant Operations, who is an after-hours emergency contact. Security was advised to stand by and monitor the situation and was additionally advised that they could leave the area if the situation became detrimental to personal safety.</p> <p>Security advised the Environmental Services employee assigned to the building to stay clear of the pool area for his safety. Security checked the locker rooms and found evidence of water entering the men's locker room, but the women's locker room appeared to be clear of flooding.</p> <p>Security monitored the situation alone until approximately 12:50, when the Lieutenant arrived on scene to observe the situation. Security monitored the area until the Plant Operations employee arrived at approximately 1:10. The Plant Operations employee entered the chemical storage/plumbing area in the basement underneath the pool and shut off the water flow by closing a control valve. He advised Security to notify Environmental Services for cleaning up any remaining water in the area surrounding the pool.</p> <p>Security was given authorization to leave the scene by the Security Lieutenant and continued their patrol of the campus. At approximately 2:05, The Lieutenant advised that the Plant Operation's employee left the Athletic & Fitness Center.</p> <p>Security re-checked the Athletics & Fitness Center pool area at approximately 2:25 and found that the water level was reduced (but still above normal) and the flooding appeared to have stopped. The standing water that was previously present from the flooding appears to have drained away through the pool overflow drains. Digital photographs from the Security camera system showing the localized flooding are attached to the original copies of this incident report.</p>

<p>On, Monday, March 7, 2011 at approximately 9:45am, a student entered into her class room (HVPA-245). While standing up in her art class (Drawing II – ART 110) she began to feel dizzy, light headed, and hot. At approximately 10:45am, the student began to get low to the ground because she knew she was in the process of fainting. When the student was on the ground she lost consciousness for a few seconds. Immediately her instructor notified the security dispatch office and informed Security of the situation. The instructor then helped the student stand up and assisted her with standing until she stated she was okay and security arrived on the scene.</p> <p>At approximately 10:46am, Security was dispatched to the Horowitz Visual Performing Arts Center, room 245 for a reported medical emergency. Upon arrival to the scene at approximately 10:48am, the Security Sergeant informed dispatch that paramedics were not needed at the scene via the decision of the student. Security walked with the student to the seating area outside of the Division Office HVPA-200. The student sat down and explained that she had no history of fainting but she only ate a piece of toast for breakfast this morning, so her blood sugar could have been low. Security then offered the student a bottle of water, a soda, an apple, and a granola bar which she took. After the student drank the water, ate the apple and granola bar she along with the security officer stayed in the seating area until approximately 11:23am, when she said she felt a lot better and returned to class.</p>

<p>On Monday, March 7, 2011, at approximately 4:25pm, Security was on patrol when they received a call from dispatch to report to the bus stop for a incident involving an altercation on campus. Upon arrival at the bus stop, Security observed Howard County Police Officer already on scene taking information from a Hispanic male student. The student stated he was on campus getting reinstated for missing too many days of class. The student further stated that while he was in the DH building on the computer, a female student asked him to turn his music down and said she hated Hispanics. He replied and called her a derogatory name and after words were exchanged, he left the building towards the bus stop. Once outside, he called his aunt for a ride. At that time, four individuals allegedly walked up on him confronting him about the incident. His aunt over heard the conversation and immediately called the police stating that her nephew was being assaulted on campus. Howard County Police arrived at approximately 4:20pm and found that no assault had occurred. The student's aunt arrived at the college shortly after the police and stated that she thought her nephew was being attacked. The student stated that no physical altercation took place. After taking statements, Howard County Police left the campus at approximately 4:40pm. Security spoke with the female student who stated that she did ask the male student to turn down his music, and that he did call her a derogatory name. She denies that there were four individuals that followed him. Further review of video footage also does not show anyone following the male student outside.</p>

At approximately 5:25pm, Security was dispatched to the Cafe concerning an altercation. Security was approached by an individual who stated that students were being loud in the cafeteria. Security reported to the Cafe and observed a Cafe employee telling several students to keep the noise level down. Among the students he addressed was a male student. The male student approached and began complaining about a female who he referred to as "a derogatory name", stating that she was probably still mad at him over some previous incident that occurred off-campus. At that time, Security escorted the male student out into the RCF lobby in front of the Welcome Center to further discuss the incident. The male student stated that he and his friends were in the cafeteria minding their business when a female approached them and asked why any of them would be calling her. The male student denied calling her, and the two of them began a verbal altercation involving obscenities from the male student. Security advised the male student that he would talk to the other students concerning this incident but advised the male student that he should go to his table and that he and his friends need to stay away from the other students and keep the noise levels down. The male student agreed. Security then approached the other three students. These students all were complaining about the male student stating that they could hear him and his friends talking about the female student, calling out her name loudly several times. The female student stated that at some point, she went over to the table and asked why the male student had been calling her name. At that point an argument ensued between those at the male's table and those who had come over from the female's table. Security advised the female and her friends at the table to avoid contact with the male and the other students. The female student agreed.

Later, at approximately 6:45pm, the female student and another male approached the RCF Security Office complaining that the male student had returned to the Cafe with another friend and that one of them started taking pictures of the people at the female's table, and at that point, she felt threatened and decided to report the incident again to security. The Security Account Manager took a statement from both of them (statement attached) and also spoke again to the male student who denied contacting them at all. The Security Account Manager again advised the male student not to have any further contact with the other students. Review of the video footage shows the first verbal altercation (included with report), and also shows the male student re-entering the Cafe at approximately 6:48 pm, but was unable to get conclusive footage of the second incident where the female student alleges that someone in the male student's group photographed them.

<p>On Thursday March 10, 2011 an Environmental Services staff member reported a fight over the radio. Upon arrival Security was confronted by the Environmental Services staff member who said she just witnessed a fight and pointed in the direction that the suspects were headed. After numerous security officers searched the campus, the individuals were unable to be located. Security asked the staff member to explain exactly what she saw occur. She stated that she saw three males and one female. The staff member said that she could not clearly identify faces. She stated that she saw a student being held from behind by another student and being attacked by the other suspect who was wearing a plaid jacket. She said she could hear the female yelling as the one student was being attacked. She said the attackers left after the the student fell to the ground. The staff member wrote a statement which is attached. The student was escorted to RCF where he was asked if he required medical assistance and if he wanted to press charges. The student refused both the medical assistance and refused to press charges. The student made a written statement which reported that he was studying inside the library with the female student when another student told him that he was too loud. The student stated that he told the other student "OK... chill". After several words were exchanged, the male student said that the unknown suspect wearing a plaid jacket replied, "Tough guy, ok lets take this outside" The male student and female student left the library and headed towards the quad to meet the individuals at approximately 4:05. He then returned to the library to retrieve his backpack. After exiting the library, he saw the male student and the suspect wearing plaid. Together they all walked back to the quad. The male student stated that the suspect wearing plaid told him lets do this out of the sight of cameras. While walking, the male student said he was cut off and the suspect in plaid swung at him. The male student then stated that the other student grabbed him from behind and began to choke him. The suspect in the plaid shirt began attacking him while the student continued to hold and choke him. The student said he blacked out after the first few punches. The student wrote a Security Incident statement which is attached.</p>			
<p>After reviewing footage, the student is seen exiting the library at 4:05. He shortly returns and exits the library with his backpack. At approximately 4:10 the suspect in plaid, the female student and the other male student are seen exiting the CL building and walking towards the quad. The students then walked outside of the camera range and the actual fight is not visible on camera. However, Security back tracked the suspect's movements on camera to where they entered the building through the parking garage. Video footage was able to capture the male student's vehicle, a black Kia Optima. Video footage, photo IDs, and incident statements from the staff member and the student are attached.</p>			
<p>At approximately 7:40, a staff member from Student Services visited the Security Office and was updated on the event. She then contacted the student and advised him that he is considered on "interim suspension" and not allowed back on campus until he was contacted by the college.</p>

<p>At approximately 2:00 on March 11, 2011, Security was ordered to assist an officer with a graffiti incident. Security discovered multiple acts of vandalism in the ST 114M men's bathroom, which is located on the 1st floor of the Science and Technology building.</p> <p>The graffiti is located on the left wall in the handicap bathroom stall (this bathroom has one stall only). Part of the graffiti reads "HCC" written in pencil with large letters. Another portion of the graffiti reads "Billy Badass" and "He kills mean walls" written in smaller letters with a pencil, with an arrow above the words. It is apparent that there are multiple holes in the wall that appear to have been created with a single-edged pocket knife with a blade approximately ½ of an inch in width. The words "Buck Knife Killer" appear to have been carved into the wall with the knife. A crude smiley face appears to have been carved into the wall with the knife.</p> <p>Security spoke with an Environmental Services Technician, and he stated that he had observed the graffiti including knife damage several days prior. Digital photographs have been taken of the graffiti and property damage and are attached to the original copies of this report. A work order e-mail regarding this incident has been sent to Plant Operations and a copy is attached to this report.</p>

<p>On March 15, 2011, Security was notified by another officer that there was an excessive amount of graffiti present on a table in the Duncan Hall Quad-side smoking area.</p> <p>The vandalized table is the fifth table from the right side of the building. The entire surface of the table has excessive amounts of graffiti present.</p> <p>The Security officer detected the graffiti at approximately 1:00 while conducting an initial patrol of the Duncan Hall building. One of the images drawn depicts what appears to be a Pokemon game character called a "Mudkip", with the words "Mudkipz" and "You", with a drawing of a small heart between the words.</p> <p>Several other portions of the graffiti are sexually explicit in nature. One drawing appears to depict a nude human female torso. A message written near this drawing reads "TEXT 443 472 6122 BIG TITS" written inside a drawing of a heart surrounded by arrows. Below the heart, the words "Ask for Candy" are written.</p> <p>One other drawing on the table appears to depict a male cartoon character with the words "Where the dubbies at??" written to the right of the drawing in a comic-style text box.</p> <p>Digital photographs have been taken of the graffiti and are attached to the original copies of this report. Plant Operations has been notified and the original work order e-mail is attached to the original copies of the report. .</p>

<p>On Tuesday March 15, 2011 at approximately 11:22am, Security dispatched to the Wellness Center for a report of a student with a medical emergency. Once Security arrived on the scene, the officer was briefed by the Wellness Center Coordinator of the situation. The Wellness Center Coordinator informed Security that at 11:00, a female student came into the Wellness Center with complications of breathing, chest pains, persistent shaking, and cold chills. The coordinator also stated that the student's blood pressure was 122/109 which was abnormal. When questioned as to whether she had eaten anything, the student said "I haven't eaten anything since dinner time last night". The student did however let Security know that the only liquid she had drunk all day was water and the last time was around 9:00am. Security also asked the student if she was on any medication which she said "nothing but birth control pills". At 11:24am Howard County Paramedics and the Crisis Communication Manager was notified. At 11:30 Howard County Ambulance 105 and Fire Engine 71 arrived at Parking Lot K. At 11:35 the student was transported to Howard County General Hospital. At 11:38, Security tried to reach the student's father on the phone number that she had given, only to realize that the student had falsified this information. The student stated numerous times that she didn't want any family notified about her condition. The Wellness Center Coordinator also tried to obtain an accurate number and in doing so resulted in another failed attempt to reach a parent/guardian. At 11:42am Fire Engine 71 and Ambulance 105 left Howard Community College premises. No further information to provide at this time.</p>

On March 16, 2011 at approximately 9:50 am, Security was dispatched to parking lot I to assist another officer with a disorderly student. The student refused to move his vehicle from the staff side of lot I after the security officer informed him that the lot was for staff and faculty permit parking only. Upon arrival, Security noticed the student involved was the same student involved in a special assignment Security was working on for the past two weeks. The assignment Security was working on tells me attempting to locate information on repeat parking violators with no information connecting the vehicle to a Howard Community College student. On March 14, 2011 at approximately 10:50am, Security located a silver Honda Element in Lot H parked in the special permit spaces in front of the Hickory Ridge building. The vehicle was on the officer's list but no one was in the vehicle at that time. Security then waited for the driver of the vehicle to return. Once the driver returned, Security then approached the vehicle and kindly asked for the driver's information. The driver of the vehicle stated that he had no identification on him. The driver then gives Security his information verbally. Security then researched the information given by the individual and found no matches in their database. On March 16, 2011 during the lot I incident, Security greeted the student involved, the name given by the individual on March 14. The individual stated another name. After the incident was cleared in lot I, Security then had this new name researched to once again not find a match. The student has falsified information twice to Security, never intending on identifying himself. His true identity was located by a staff member of the security department. No further information to report at this time.

On March 16, 2011, at approximately 9:30am, Security observed a vehicle parking in the faculty half of Lot I. The two occupants of the vehicle; a male and female exited the vehicle and headed towards the Hickory Ridge building. Security approached the vehicle and noticed it did not have a faculty hang tag visible; Security then called the driver back to the car. Security advised the young man that he was unauthorized to park in the area without the proper hang tag displayed. The male stated that "I'm not moving it and I refuse to because there is no where else to park"! Security advised the gentleman that if he left his vehicle in the space, his vehicle would be cited and/or towed away at his expense. The gentleman then said if you "if tow it you will be dealt with" and Security asked the gentleman "what does that mean and he said take it how you want it" and that's when Security said their supervisor is on the way to talk to you about this situation. The individual stated "I'll wait then". As he waited, Security notified the mobile unit to accompany on this situation and when the Officer arrived he also explained to the individual of the parking situation. Again the individual refused to move his vehicle. When the other officer arrived she also advised the individual to move his vehicle from the staff parking lot or it will get ticketed and towed. The individual refused until the officer asked for his license or student ID and his reply was "I don't have a license." When Security advised the individual that Howard county police will be notified, the individual got in his vehicle and drove off campus.

<p>On Wednesday March 16, 2011, at approximately 10:09am, Security was dispatched to the Athletic and Fitness Center ladies locker room for a reported medical emergency. Upon arrival to the scene at approximately 10:11, a participant in the Senior Aquatics class, was conscious and sitting on the floor of the ladies locker room shower stall, holding a bag of ice on her right elbow. Security immediately asked the individual if she needed any medical attention or request of the paramedics to be on scene.
