She assumed he was also walking to his vehicle. When she reached her vehicle in Parking Lot "B" (on the side closest to the bus stop) the individual approached her from the rear, grabbed her buttocks, pulled open her vehicle door and told her to "get in". She refused, telling him "No" loudly several times. He seemed flustered and backed away. She hurried into her car and locked the door. He struggled with the door handle trying to open the door. She started her vehicle and drove away. She last observed him walking towards the bus stop. She proceeded to the Howard County Police Department and reported the incident; complaint # 08-52978. The student returned to HCC at 8:21pm and reported the incident to security. A request was made with a Plant Operations staff member in reference to any security cameras that may have recorded the incident. He advised that there are no cameras on "B" lot at this time. The assailant was described as a black male, 5-5 mid forties, wearing dark jeans, black sweater and gray facial hair, wearing sunglasses and a black baseball hat.</p>

The officer advised that they did not have a rendering and that they would work with the details provided by the student at 8:00pm on May 29 when she reported the incident.
