<p>On May 2, 2011 at approximately 1:00pm dispatch notified the mobile unit to report to HR building first floor to assist an Instructor with a student who was suffering from chest pain and high blood pressure, 911 was called by instructor at this time. Security Account Manager another Security Officer responded from Lot H. Upon arrival, the student was sitting in the hallway on the wood bench with her head in her hands and her elbows on her knees. The student was conscious, alert, and oriented to person, place, and time. She complained of heart palpitations, dizziness, nausea, and high blood pressure. As Security was obtaining pertinent medical information, Security obtained a pulse of 74 beats per minute. The student said she was sitting in class when her heart palpitations and dizziness occurred; it was at this time her nursing classmates took her blood pressure. They got a high blood pressure of 170/110. The student reported no health history, although she recently discovered her blood pressure was running high at a recent doctor's appointment. The student said she had taken Tylenol for the headache she had woken up with and had been having on again off again since the morning of 5/02/2011. She had also taken Zyrtec earlier this morning. The student reported a newly developed allergy to Ibuprofen. After enough information was relayed to the 911 dispatcher, Security moved the student to a nearby room for privacy. Howard County Paramedic Engine 71 arrived, followed shortly by Howard County Ambulance 105. Security relayed all information they obtained to 911 emergency personnel. The student was advised that due to her high blood pressure she should be taken to the hospital to be checked out. Paramedic 105 assisted the student to the ambulance and transported her to Howard County General Hospital at approximately 1:25. The student's classmates and instructor at the time of her departure were attempting to contact family to notify them of the student's whereabouts and to attend to relating issues. No further information provided.</p>

<p>At approximately 6:45pm, the Security office was notified by the Welcome Center that there was a possible medical emergency in the Quad area. Security went to the scene to investigate. Security immediately sat the student on the ground so he would not fall down. 911 was called. Security watched over the student and collected all relevant information. Other officers came to the scene and assisted with directions for the ambulance. When talking to the student, he said that he was in class at Duncan Hall, started feeling ill and left class to take himself to the hospital. Classmates followed him out and stopped him in the Quad. The students then alerted the Welcome Center who in turn alerted Security. Ambulance 75 from Howard County arrived at approximately 6:57 and transported the student to Howard County General Hospital. Upon further investigation of the vehicle, the Security officer was called to the security office to try and view video footage but was unable to obtain any. At 11:54am, a Caucasian female with black hair/blonde highlights, two lip piercings in the corners of her mouth, blue blouse shirt, blue jeans, and green flip flop thong sandals on appeared. When she approached the vehicle, Security informed her that she needed to meet with the Director of Security, received a citation for improperly parking her vehicle, and was almost towed if we did not successfully locate her. Security then asked if she could provide her school ID so they could obtain the required information needed for the supervisor to take necessary action, but the individual stated that she did not need to give any kind of ID because she was about to leave campus. The individual got into the vehicle and drove off making a right turn onto Little Patuxent Parkway.

Upon further investigation of the situation, a student was identified as the driver of the Nissan Quest. The student was in violation of the student handbook under Code Violations for not cooperating with producing a college ID when asked by a College Official or Security Officer.

Security advised the female that an incident report will be completed and gave her the security office phone number, and advised her of an escort service that we offer.

The black male was later identified as a student. The student ID picture was confirmed by the female, stating that the individual on the ID card was the same individual that harassed her.

On Thursday, May 12, 2011, at approximately 5:45pm, Security made a follow-up phone call to the male student in reference to the harassment report submitted earlier to the Security Office by the female. Security advised the male the circumstances surrounding the call, that the female stated that he had made unwanted advancements to her at the Athletic and Fitness Center and that he had passed her a note with his name and phone number. Security also advised him that an incident report had been submitted to Student Services and warned him not to have any contact with the female or any other female student. The male student stated that he and the female had a general, mutual conversation that did not involve anything personal at all. He stated that he followed up the conversation by handing her his name and number in case she wanted to keep in touch. Security reminded him not to have any contact with the female and advised him that Student Services may be contacting him concerning the incident. The male student apologized for the incident and stated that he would cooperate with anything the school wanted him to do.

On May 20, 2011 at approximately 11:20a, Security was dispatched to the lower level of the ST parking garage. Upon arrival, Plant Operations personnel were on the scene. A Plant Operations employee explained that a medium piece of concrete chipped from the ceiling of the parking garage and fell off. Security was also made aware by Plant Operations that this occurred before Spring Break; April 18, 2011. They advised Security that a vehicle parked in the third parking space from the rear stairwell, facing the Plant Operations shed, where the concrete piece fell, coincidentally had a dent on the hood of the vehicle. The Plant Operations employee showed Security that the vehicle; a grey Saturn VUE XR and its dent was not aligned with the placement of the fallen cement, nor were there any scratches. At approximately 1:10am on 5/20/11, Security was contacted via radio an Environmental Services technician reporting that a person was stuck in an elevator adjacent to the Nursing Building breezeway. Security arrived at the first floor Nursing building elevator adjacent to the breezeway at approximately 1:15am. When Security arrived at the scene, they found that the elevator outer doors had been opened and the elevator inner doors were partially opened. Several other Environmental Services technicians were present and were attempting to gain further access to the elevator. It was apparent that the elevator malfunction had been caused by a vacuum cleaner power cord becoming jammed between the elevator doors. An Environmental Services Supervisor informed Security that the vacuum cleaner was located on the LR level of the Nursing Building and it was visible to Security that the cord had been extended through the elevator car and plugged into an extension cord on the first floor of the Nursing building. The elevator car was stopped on the first floor of the Nursing building. Security disconnected the vacuum cleaner power cord for safety. At approximately 1:16, Security was able to successfully open the elevator car's inner doors and the Environmental Services technician, exited the elevator without difficulty. Security asked the technician "Are you OK?" and she replied "Yeah, I'm fine" while laughing. Security then proceeded to the LR level of the Nursing building using the elevator and retrieved the vacuum cleaner, which then brought to the Nursing building 1st floor and returned to the technician.
