<p>On date and time stated above, Security was notified by a lifeguard at the pool) that she heard a loud crash sound above the area where she was sitting. Right after the sound she stated that she smelled a light smoke odor. Security immediately evacuated the locker rooms, weight room and gym area. A Plant operation employee responded to the area to investigate the situation checking the pool area and also the upstairs area of the building. The Plant Operation employee advised security that all was clear and that there was no need for the Fire Department to be called. He also advised security that wires from a light balance crossed, causing the lights to go out, which led to the burning odor. An Athletic & Fitness Tech was advised by the Plant Operation's employee to open the pool windows so the smoke smell could leave the area. The Plant Operation's employee contacted his supervisor and then advised security that he would continue to monitor the area.</p>
