Summary			
Security was dispatched to the elevator in the parking garage in reference to graffiti inside the elevator. Inspection of the elevator revealed that someone had written the word "WHO" on the front wall and the left side wall of the elevator. Review of the security camera in the elevator revealed two individuals entering the elevator. The first subject was a white male, dark hair and full beard. He was wearing a blue shirt and carrying a black bag with an archer with a drawn bow. The second subject was a white male with over the ear light brown hair. The subject with the beard wrote the word WHO on the front wall of the elevator. The elevator stopped at one of the floors and the doors opened. The bearded subject pushed the close doors button and proceeded to write the word WHO on the left side wall of the elevator. The elevator stopped at another floor and the two subjects exited.			
Prints of the incident were obtained from Plant Operations and disseminated to the security staff in an attempt to locate and identify the culprits.			
Disposition		<p>On 9-12-06 at approximately 12:00, the Security Director, observed an individual walking in the Galleria who appeared to fit the description of the bearded suspect. The individual was carrying the same black bag with an archer printed on the side. Further investigation revealed the suspects identity as an HCC student. Initially, the student denied writing on the walls of the elevator, but when presented with photographs taken from the security camera, he confessed to committing the act. He denied knowing the identity of the other subject. The student was asked if the letters WHO had any significance and what message was he trying to send by writing this on the elevator wall. He stated he did not know why he wrote it and did not intend to send any particular message to the reader.</p> <p>On 9-12-06 at approximately 2:00, the student appeared at the security office and presented a letter of apology for defacing school property.</p>

X-rays revealed that she had cracked 6 front teeth.</p> <p>An Athletics & Fitness Center staff member advised that the individual stated that a white male, blonde hair allegedly witnessed the incident. Disposition	<p>An Assistant Lacrosse Coach responded to a campus wide email for a witness to this incident. He advised that was in his vehicle and exiting a parking space when he observed a women fall in the area of the parking lot and the entrance to the old tennis courts. He states that from a distance it appeared that she fell head first into the blacktop. The coach drove to her location to see if he could offer any assistance. Upon arrival, she had risen to her feet and he observed that she was bleeding from the mouth. She advised that she had tripped on a peace of metal that was attached to the blacktop and that it was not easily visible. She advised that she would be all right, though it was evident that she was shaken. She left under her own power.</p>
