On, Thursday, September 1, 2011 at approximately 12:30pm, a female individual approached the Security office and stated that someone had keyed her car (black Ford Mustang) in the parking lot. Security gave her a Security Incident Statement form to fill out. After the individual filled the form out, the student stated that she had parked her vehicle in Parking Lot A, from 10:00 to 12:00. Upon coming back to her vehicle, she noticed keyed marks on her driver side door. She stated that she was waiting for a parking spot, parked her car, exited the car, and walked from Parking Lot A to her class, when another student driving through the parking lot, gave her the middle finger. After taking pictures of her vehicle, Security advised her that an investigation will be conducted and usually takes 2-3 business days. Pictures will be located with the original report. This incident is still on-going and occurred at Howard Community College.

After reviewing the video footage of Lot A on September 1, 2011; Security located the owner of the black Ford Mustang, coming down the second aisle nearest Little Patuxent Parkway at 9:59am. The student's vehicle comes to a stop at the end of the aisle where it meets the first aisle nearest Little Patuxent Parkway and is simultaneously met by a blue Chevrolet to the right and a tan/gold Toyota to the left of her vehicle. A dark colored van exits a parking space on the first aisle and the student parks in the empty space. The blue Chevrolet continues down the first aisle and exits the campus via the main circle onto Little Patuxent Parkway. Meanwhile, the tan/gold Toyota pulls forward towards the student's vehicle, pauses momentarily then proceeds to exit Lot A via Faculty drive and heads towards the ST parking garage. The tan/gold Toyota vehicle is seen in the ST parking garage driving up every level in attempts to find a parking space. At 10:06am. the tan/gold Toyota is seen exiting the ST parking garage and immediately re-entering and parking on the lower level of the garage. Security was able to identify the owner and vehicle model from the license plate reader in the ST garage. The owner of the beige Toyota Camry was identified as a student. After parking her vehicle on the lower level of the ST parking garage, Security then observed the student walking from the ST garage back to Lot A via Faculty Drive. The student is seen on camera going to the same aisle and area that the other student parked her black Ford Mustang. The student is then seen walking in between two dark colored vehicles, one being the other student, then walking through Lot A to Duncan Hall via the pathway. Security asked the student to come back to the Security office to look at a few images captured from the roadside entrance of Duncan Hall as well as the cameras on the first floor of Duncan Hall near DH 110 of the suspect. The student identified the individual as the young lady that gave her the middle finger earlier that morning over a parking space.

Disposition	<p>On 9/16/11 at 2:00pm, the Director of Security interviewed the student regarding this incident. She was advised first of videotape regarding an incident on Lot A at which time she stated. "Now I know what this is about."</p> <p>The student advised that she was waiting for a car to pull out of a space and once it did a black mustang sped into the open space. (on video). The student advised she then drove to the ST parking garage and found a space and then walked back to Lot A. (on video). The student was seen going through Lot A and walked up to the side of the black mustang (on video). The mustang was later identified as the other student.</p> <p>The student advised that she was very angry at the vehicle cutting her off into the space. She stated she intentionally went back to "key" the car. She stated "I figured it would have been a good way to get back at the driver at the time". She admitted that it was a horrible decision and was sorry for the damage.</p> <p>A written statement was obtained from the student and is part of this report. The Director of Security contacted the other student's mother, and advised her of the results of this investigation. The mother was given the phone number of the student to discuss any restitution. This report is to be sent to Student Services for Code of Conduct review and disposition.</p>

On Friday, September 2, 2011 at approximately 2:50pm, Security was on routine patrol of the main building, when a Plant Operations employee, an Administrative Assistant, and a female student, approached Security and stated that they needed to have an incident report filled out. Security took the student to the back of main building and gathered her personal information. The student stated that she and her boyfriend had an altercation in a Hickory Ridge math class. The student said "She was trying to leave class when her boyfriend followed her and physically assaulted her in front of the Hickory Ridge building." She stated that her boyfriend stomped on her feet, grabbed her violently, and became verbally aggressive. The boyfriend called the female student while Security was talking to her and the Security officer had her call him back so the officer could get him over to security personnel. A couple of minutes later, the boyfriend walked through the breezeway with his hands clinched and eyes teary. The Security Lieutenant was on scene with the Security officer talking with the boyfriend but he declined to give security any information regarding the incident. The officer left the Security Lieutenant with the male student while the officer went to obtain some medical supplies because they noticed the male student's right hand knuckle area was bleeding and swollen. Security asked the male student if he needed any medical attention, where he stated "NO". Security bandaged his hand even though he declined. Statements were obtained from the Security Sergeants and male student:

On September 6, 2011 at approximately 4:41pm, Security was notified by a staff member about a possible altercation outside of Duncan Hall. Security arrived at 4:42 and observed a group of 7 black male students gathered around a picnic table on the far side of DH in the quad engaging in some type of argument. When Security asked them to present their student ID's, one of them began to walk away. Security notified dispatch and at approximately 4:44 pm, the Security Lieutenant and Sergeant arrived on scene. Security identified the students who were trying to leave the scene in the direction of the HVPA Bldg., and Security followed them into the building to obtain identification and get a statement. Two other officers remained at DH to take statements from the students seated at the picnic table. The students at DH were identified. These gentlemen all stated that they were sitting at the picnic table talking when one of the other black students began engaging them aggressively over something he thought they had said directed at them. One student stated that he and his friends had never seen these individuals before, and they were speaking in their native Jamaican language about subjects not related to the other students. He stated that the other two students began soliciting them to fight them and one of them mentioned that they had a "gauge" (i.e. gun) waiting for them. A Security officer showed up before the argument escalated further.

The students who left the scene and went to the HVPA were identified. After getting ID information from all students, one student stated that he and another student were walking up the quad by Duncan hall when he noticed that a group of students sitting in the outside area by the benches were all talking about them in a different language. As they walked past, the student stated that he asked who they were talking to which resulted in a verbal confrontation between the individuals, Two students stated that another student said "I shoot people, I have guns for you" along with other words exchanged that were not repeated to me. Security asked the student if they were speaking in a different language, how he knew they were talking about them. The student stated that he heard them use the term "bombaclat" and they were looking in his direction. The student also stated that it was the Jamaican students that talked about fighting and using guns. He stated that there had been tension between these individuals for about two weeks over some females that lost interest in the other group of male students. The students were advised that their information would be forwarded to Student Services and that they were not to have any further contact with each other. Video footage shows the students gathered outside of Duncan Hall but was unable to determine which of the students initiated the altercation.

On Monday, 9/12/2011, at approximately 7:17pm, Security was on patrol when they received a call from dispatch stating there was an incident in the AF building. Upon arrival to AF, Security noticed a student standing in the lobby area with an AF staff member. The student stated that someone stole her Samsung laptop computer out of her bookbag (pink and white), which was in locker #9 inside the women's locker room. She stated that she placed her bag in the locker but did not put a lock on it. She stated that she had done this several times in the past without incident. Security gathered her contact information as well as the description of the bag and laptop and contacted dispatch to see if there was any video footage of the incident. Dispatch reported that the video footage was reviewed but did not show anyone taking or walking out with the laptop. No further information to provide at this time.

On 9/14/11 at approximately 3:35pm, the student came to the Security Office (RCF-117) to check if her laptop had been turned into security. Earlier in the day, an Athletics & Fitness staff member had turned in a laptop to Security that he had found in the Athletic Center. After checking the laptop that was found by the staff member, it turned out to be the one that the student was looking for. After going through the information in the laptop with the student, and confirming that it belonged to her, security had her sign a lost and found form and released the laptop to her. No further information provided.

<p>On Thursday, September 15, 2011, Security was contacted by Dispatch to report to the Studio Theater and meet with a staff member (House Manager for Rep Stage), who was standing in the lobby area of HVPA. The House Manager stated that there were two individuals who had illegally gained access into the performance which was in progress. He also stated that the individuals were aware that one of them was not going to be able to get into the performance due to the fact that he did not have a ticket. Security then called the Security Sergeant and Lieutenant for assistance. Once the play was over, the Security Lieutenant and House Manager went into the theater to escort the individuals out for questioning. After gathering their contact information, the individuals were identified as a student and a non-student. The Security Sergeant questioned the student as to how many tickets he purchased and his response was three (one for himself, one for his sister, and one for the non-student). The House Manager confirmed that he received two tickets; one for the student and one for his sister. The non-student was not present when the tickets were purchased and was supposed to be arriving late. The student stated that he purchased and reserved a ticket for the non-student under a name which is the non-student's middle name. The Security Sergeant asked the non-student where his ticket was and he advised that he left it in the theater. The Security Sergeant escorted him to the theater but found no ticket. Later, the non-student changed his story to say that his ticket was still in the box office. He was then asked how he gained access to the theater without a ticket and he was unable to give an answer. The student finally stated that he was unable to get the ticket due to the fact that the non-student was running late and was unable to make it to the box office in time to receive his ticket. He also stated that they were going to get the tickets changed to a later date but instead, decided just to find another way into the play. The House Manager stated that when he first met with the student, he explained to him that they would not be letting anyone one else into the theater since the box office was closed and the play had already started. The Security Sergeant explained that security would initiate an incident report which would be forwarded to Student Services. He also explained to the student that since he was the only HCC student that he could be held responsible for sneaking his friend in to the performance. The House Manager advised that he would check with the box office on the next business date to confirm the reserved ticket.</p> <p>On 9/16/11 at approximately 1:35pm, Security spoke with a staff member of the Rep Theater department in reference to incident on 9/15/11. She stated that a ticket was left for the individual but he was late for the show. The theater has a late comers seating policy which was handed to Security by the staff member and will be attached to the original report. The staff member also handed Security a copy of the House Manager's report which will also be attach to the original. No further information at this time.</p>

On September 21, 2011 at approximately 11:00am, Security was dispatched to the fourth level, ST parking garage to obtain an individual's information that was driving a white Porsche Boxter involved in a past incident involving speeding inside the ST garage. Security met the individual in on the third level of the ST parking garage driving his vehicle. After asking him to stop and wait out of the way of traffic while Security obtained his information, Security observed the student smoking inside his vehicle. Security immediately informed him of the campus smoking policy and asked him to extinguish his cigarette. The student then asked for an explanation as to why he could not smoke in his own vehicle on campus. Security informed the student again of the campus smoking policy.

At approximately 11:04 am, the Security Sargeant asked the officer if he was in need of any assistance (over the radio) and the officer responded yes, due to the student's slight attitude and unwillingness to extinguish his cigarette continuing to ask why he could not smoke while in his own vehicle on campus. Security informed the student he would be getting a citation for not complying with the campus smoking policy. Once again, the officer asked the student to put the cigarette out immediately and he did so, by dropping it outside his vehicle onto the ground in front of the Security officer. Security again asked the student for his information (driver's license and student ID) which he admitted to being a Howard Community College student but not having a student ID made. At approximately 11:08am, the Security Sargeant arrived and took over the scene,

At approximately 11:12am the Security Account Manager arrived on the scene and assisted with explaining the situation to the student as to why his information was needed and that his next step should be to obtain a student ID card immediately or he would be in violation of the HCC student Code of Conduct. At approximately 11:21am, the student left the scene with his vehicle and headed to the Security Office. The student was met at the office by the Security Account Manager and had a student ID made. On September 27, 2011 at 1:57pm, an Arts and Humanities employee called security dispatch to report an injury to an adjunct faculty member.
