

Employee Survey

Each year, the college distributes a series of web-based employee surveys. Budgeted employees, adjunct faculty, and contracted staff (Canteen and public safety) are asked to rate services and initiatives across the campus on a five-point scale (with five being the most positive). In Spring 2025, 29 percent of the budgeted employees participated. All items on the Employe Survey have a **benchmark** of at least 3.5 (on a scale of 5). The benchmark for this indicator was raised to **4.0** in 2008. The average rating across the questions related to *Effective Strategic Planning* this year was 3.69.



There was a multi-faceted and inclusionary college-wide process to formulate the new strategic plan which launch on July 1, 2025.

Board Talking Points:

- Of all the Howard County residents who enrolled as first-time, full-time freshmen in any Maryland institution, 19.6 percent chose to attend HCC.
- Of all the Howard County residents, the college attracted 72.5 percent of all the parttime undergraduates enrolled in Maryland institutions.
- HCC serves a diverse student body (73.7 percent).
