Requirements:

- Grade B or higher in Culinary Arts I and II and/or Baking and Pastry coursework.
- Completion of Articulation Credit Form, submission of form with final high school transcript to the Admissions Office at Howard Community College, and recommendation from current CCPS Culinary Arts Instructor.
- Enrollment within one year of high school graduation or after two years based on relevant work experience and with permission of the HCC Business and Computer Systems Division Chair upon recommendation of Director of Hospitality and Culinary Management Programs.


Benefit:

- Up to 10 articulated college course credits at Howard Community College
- Tuition for credits earned by articulation will be waived for CMGT 101, HMGT 120, HMGT 220, and HMGT 111.

This agreement shall remain in effect provided that a yearly review of the agreement is conducted by participating faculty and supervising personnel. Evidence of such a review shall be submitted to the chairperson of the Business and Computer Systems Division at Howard Community College.
