Construction of the **Cathy and Danny Bell Workforce Development & Trades Center** officially began on May 7, 2025. In the months since the groundbreaking, final floor plans and equipment lists have been completed to ensure the 51,041-square-foot facility maximizes student success. State-of-the-art labs will support credit programs in Mechatronics, Manufacturing Technology, Welding Technology, and Automotive Technology. Students will train on industry-standard equipment including Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC), CNC machines, robots, manual mills and lathes, 3D and laser printers, and multiphase welders. Welding graduates will be eligible for certification by the American Welding Society (AWS), while Automotive Technology students will train in six bays designed for gas, diesel, electric, and heavy-duty vehicles, with accreditation pursued through Automotive Service Excellence (ASE).

The center will also house noncredit programs in plumbing, electrical, and HVACR, each with dedicated labs to support apprenticeships and licensure. A two-story multi-purpose lab will bring trades together for collaborative, real-world projects with green technology integration. Opening in fall 2026, the center is expected to enroll approximately 170 students in credit programs and 150 students in noncredit skilled trades, preparing the region's workforce for high-demand careers.

FINISH LINE CAMPAIGN: CLEARING THE PATH TO GRADUATION

At Howard Community College, we believe that no student should be stopped just short of their goal because of a financial obstacle. The Finish Line Campaign was launched to ensure that students are not held back at the very end of their academic journey by small but significant account balances. These final hurdles, often just a few hundred dollars, can prevent students from graduating or registering for the next semester, especially those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

The fund primarily supports students with outstanding balances that are preventing graduation, but it also extends to those who meet HCCEF scholarship criteria and maintain continuous enrollment, even if they are not yet graduating. In doing so, the campaign helps students stay on track, continue their studies, and move forward with their lives.

During the 2024-2025 academic year, the Finish Line Campaign raised \$98,000, offering critical support to 34 graduating students and 59 continuing students. Among those helped were nine Howard P.R.I.D.E. students who faced financial holds during the holidays. Thanks to the generosity of Dr. Lillian Bauder, these students were able to register for the next semester and continue their progress uninterrupted. "Supporting students at this critical point in their journey is one of the most meaningful ways we can invest in the future of our community," said Dr. Bauder. "When we remove the final financial barriers, we empower students to finish strong and take their next steps with confidence. I believe deeply in the mission of Howard Community College and in the potential of every student who walks through its doors."



Mildred Murray, another dedicated supporter of the campaign, echoed these sentiments. A passionate advocate for education, Murray has championed the Finish Line initiative from its earliest days. "I want to help students leave Howard Community College without debt," she shared. "Education whether through a degree, certificate, or trades credential is the key to building a stronger country. An educated community is an empowered community."

Behind the scenes, the Financial Aid Office works closely with students and donors to identify those most in need. Detra Hooper, Director of Financial Aid Services, emphasized the broader impact of the campaign: "This initiative is about ensuring that our students who have worked so hard to earn their degrees aren't held back because of a financial hardship. By removing these final financial obstacles, we're empowering them to step confidently into their futures."



With the rising debt among students and growing concerns about potential reductions in federal financial aid, the Finish Line Scholarship will continue to be a key priority in the year ahead. Howard Community College remains steadfast in its commitment to equity, student success, and the power of community support to transform lives.
