# Spring 2022 Registration Instructions for English Institute students

## How to Register

Registration is by appointment with an English Institute (EI) Advisor. Email for a registration appointment at [ei@howardcc.edu](mailto:ei@howardcc.edu). Our advisors will either video chat with you through Zoom and help you choose your classes or set up an in-person appointment. New students only complete a placement test.

## When to Pay

- **Register on or before November 30:** payment due December 1
- **Register on or after December 1:** payment due immediately

## Placement Policy

- **First week of class:** class level may change based on assessment and teacher recommendation
- **After first week of class:** no class changes
- **To move to next level in next semester:** grade must be 80%+. Must complete both A and B sections of grammar classes to move to next level.

## Winter 2022 Course Schedule

### **ENGL-084 Academic Intermediate Writing and Grammar for ESL Students (3 units)**

In this course, students will acquire the English language skills needed to produce paragraphs at an intermediate proficiency level. A variety of reading selections and discussion activities will serve to prepare students to compose paragraphs that demonstrate critical thinking. Writing themes will help students to develop a global awareness. Paragraph development will progress to the production of an organized essay by the end of the semester. Grammatical skills will be developed through formal instruction, group editing, and computer-assisted instruction. Books not included.

### **Writing and Grammar 4B (3 units)**

Improve academic writing skills! This upper-intermediate class focuses on paragraph-level writing tasks. Through writing, address ESL problems with vocabulary, spelling, and grammar. Prepare for college classes or TOEFL. Computer typing skills required.

## **LEVEL 5 & 6**

### **ENGL-085 Academic Advanced Oral Communication for ESL Students (3 units)**

In this course, students will develop the listening and speaking skills needed to succeed at a US college or university. Class work will consist of pronunciation practice, listening activities, small group and class discussions of selected readings and lectures, oral presentations, and simulations of aspects of academic life. If students place into both a level 5 reading and writing course, they are required to take ENGL-085. Students can be exempted from this requirement by passing an oral exam. Students placed into ENGL-083 AND ENGL-084 must complete both ENGL-083 and ENGL-084 before taking ENGL-085.

In addition to reading comprehension and vocabulary skill-building, students will respond to information and concepts from a diversity of assigned materials, both orally and in writing. Co-requisite: INFO-100. Books not included.

**Reading and Vocabulary 5B (3 units)**

Read interesting articles and books to improve reading, speaking, and writing skills while learning new vocabulary! Activities will include lots of discussion and interaction. This academic and interesting class will increase reading speed and improve reading comprehension. This class is perfect for students who are preparing for college study or want a more demanding class.

**ENGL-087 Academic Advanced Writing and Grammar for ESL Students (3 units)**

In ENGL-087, students will acquire the English language skills needed to write multi-paragraph compositions at a level of correctness and fluency appropriate for an advanced learner of English who will soon enroll in a college composition class. Readings and discussions will prepare students to write narrative, descriptive, expository and

argumentative compositions that reflect critical analysis. Writing themes will help students to develop a global awareness. Relevant grammatical skills will be developed through formal instruction, group editing and computer-assisted instruction. Books not included.

Mon, Wed 12pm-1:50pm Jan 31-May 18 (In-Person)

### **Writing and Grammar 5B** (3 units)

Advanced students, don't miss this chance to improve academic writing skills. If you are planning to attend a college or university in the U.S. or take the TOEFL, this class will help you develop the writing skills to be successful. Focus on organization, editing, and developing well-written essays and address ESL problems with vocabulary, spelling, and grammar.

### **Advanced TOEFL Preparation Level 6** (3 units)

This course is designed to help students develop the advanced grammar, reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills required on the iBT version of the TOEFL. Work with lab software and online programs.

### **\*Advanced Pronunciation Training \*Professional English Certificate\* series** (3 units)

Reduce your foreign accent and learn to pronounce English in a way that will make others understand you better! You will receive classroom instruction using the newest approaches and software. On two class days, special individual sessions will be held instead of the regular class. You will work with trained pronunciation professionals who will help build your speech profile and give you specific errors to eliminate. This is a perfect class for business professionals, academic instructors, or students wishing to improve speaking for business or academic purposes.

### **\*English for Professional Leadership \*Professional English Certificate\* series** (3 units)

This course is designed for advanced students who wish to develop language skills in the area of business leadership. The course focuses on current management topics including leadership styles, motivation, recruiting, marketing, use of teams, strategy, dealing with change, managing across cultures, downsizing, finances, risk management, and decision making. A key component of the course is exposure to contemporary management vocabulary.

### **INFO-100 Information Literacy/Success** (3 units)

This course teaches students a core of information literacy and critical thinking skills that will transfer to other coursework and will help them to reach academic and professional goals. Students will learn and refine strategies for college success and will strengthen their capacity for effective academic and professional communication and

use of information resources. Through research, reading, writing, and reflection, students will assess their strengths and goals in the context of pathways for academic and career exploration. Co-requisite: ENGL-086. Books not included.
